Nowadays when people give, they give mainly material things. "Can you give some more? Do you need more than that?" we may ask, even if this is only financial help and it is not enough. As Christians, followers of Christ we may consider donations as something we give or we receive, e.g.: home, clothes, food, money, knowledge etc. Is there something more than these? I think and I experience that the greatest gift I can give is the inheritance of God, in spiritual lives. The most important things are faith, hope and love we know this from our childhood and we learned it in Sunday School. Yet I wonder if I am able to pass these on to people around me, to the residents in our Shelters. To be honest, I fail many times. I struggle with my own problems and challenges and whatever I give I give it from my own strength, moved to do so by my own self. And when I fail, and I do fail, people cannot see my faith, only my tears. Those people we work with have lost everything which they were sure of in this life: they have lost their families, jobs and properties. Early last summer many lost everything in few minutes in the flood. They can truly say that they lost everything they had in this world. But as Christians we know something: we know that we may lose things one by one or everything suddenly, we cannot lose what has been done for us in Christ. Even in trials, even when we lose everything we must know that Someone is on our side, who has done everything for us, who loves us the most. He gave his own life that we may not perish. God knows what we need and how much we can bear in times of

trouble and he does not let our burden become greater than our ability to bear it. What can you give in times of trouble? You can share that the most important things are faith, hope and love. All of us can testify to this, which gives encouragement in times of trial. Believe in Jesus, that he is there for us even in the most difficult times. The greatest miracle is that he gives himself. He is by our side, he lives with us and dwells in us if we call upon him and wait for him. He is the One who gives us strength, endurance, hope and joy. He creates possibilities even in impossible situations, for he gives himself. He gives peace in trouble and he gives happiness and satisfaction. He gives himself though you and through me if we let him. The poet says: "You know there are miracles even today, you just need to recognize them"

The Men's Shelter

Life in the Men's Shelter

Due to the economic crisis there are more and more lives in crisis too and more and more homeless people in Hungary. There are more and more unemployed, more and more people who are not able to pay their mortgage or their current expenses and more and more people become victims of usury and home mafia. Auctions take place and floods make people hopeless.

Jesus says to us: "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (Jn 16:33). This means that even the fear of our own existence is overcome if we stay on the Victor's side. Whoever stands on the side of triumph of Jesus Christ at the Cross and at the side of victory over hell and death, will experience victory in body and life. More and more people are applying to be resident at the Men's Shelter, and with Christian love and patience we are ready to help them. Sadly there are some residents who do not want or are not able to take this opportunity. I want to share about them.

One young man who had a broken relationship with his family, but wanted to finish his studies and pass A level, became our resident. He promised that he would attend the school and would study. Sadly he was not able to keep his word, and we had to send him away.

One of our residents found legal employment after a long search. But after a month he neglected his work. After a time we realised that he wanted to get out of his responsibilities. There are other situations where people work but their employers do not want to pay them, or they employ them illegally. At quiet times before dinner often pray for "fair wages for fair works".

There is a situation when someone works hard, has no addiction, tries his best to save up and suddenly he loses his job. He uses up what he has and he starts again, having nothing. More and more residents receive training or driving licence, supported by a grant.

We are happy to see that some of the men take this opportunity and successfully finish their training.

The old student moves on

I am the student who moves on, a student of God who is leaving one of her schools now. I would like to say good bye to the readers of the Menedék news for I have finished my ministry after 16 great

years in Bodrog. These years were great for they were gifts from God to me and whatever I did I did it with joy. I won't be able to make a list of the many things I had learnt during these years.

After my conversion in my adolescence I was praying to God asking him to show me how to serve him. I joined in activities that already existed in my church and recognized that I needed to develop new areas of ministry e.g.: bible study for teens.

In the early 90s the "Village Mission" was run by students at the Baptist Seminary. This movement involved lots of young people, especially in summer when we were involved in street evangelism and in helping small churches. I had many opportunities to share the Good News about God's love, to help many to find the One who saved and healed my own life.

I kept seeking God's will and leading in my life as I was studying at the teacher training college. I asked God to use me as a teacher or any other way according to his will. That time I got to know the Menedék (Refuge) Foundation in Budapest as I was replacing someone for a few weeks at the Women's Shelter (that was the predecessor of today's Mother Shelter). It was a very difficult task for me but I knew that God could enable me to help girls whose previous lifestyle was very far from me. The Lord always gave me the wisdom and the help I needed.

During my weeks in the Shelter I heard about the plan to start a primary school in Bodrog, Géza Huszár challenged me with the thought of going there to teach. So I visited Bodrog and met the fostering families and saw the kindergarten. It was fantastic to see the unity among the fostering parents, they were able to strengthen each other in faith and they were able to realize great decisions.

After much prayer, with great peace I was able to

Our church has received many different kinds of help from churches and from private persons, from people and from fellowship who love God and seek his will, and want to serve him with their lives and belongings.

On behalf of the Menedék (Refuge) Foundation, Mr. Zoltán Kovács, the Chairman of the Foundation expressed his joy and thanks to those who were together in the work and in the celebration. He shared that an old dream was realized as the building was completed and shared his hope that it may bring glory to God in the future.

The children of the kindergarten and the primary school sang a few songs. It was a joy to see the children who are the main beneficiaries and users of the BOK.

It was a special joy to have some people from England and from Northern Ireland, who represented the churches who helped us a lot. From Bloomfield Presbyterian Church and from Newtownards people brought personal greetings. The greetings of the Dungannon Baptist Church was put on the screen. From St. Mark's Anglican Church, Tunbridge Wells, Mary Fisher and Roger Cusdin brought greetings.

On behalf of ACSI, Brother Alan Brown spoke, and on the Building Ambassadors' greetings were passed by Endre Békési.

We closed our celebration with a fellowship meal. It would be difficult to write down all the events of that day precisely, to express the great joy we had, to share all the experience and the story of the building project. make a decision to go 200 kms away from my family to start a new life. I was very happy for I knew that God had sent me there and I knew that I was going to work with people who loved and served the Lord and sought his will too. So I moved here in the summer of 1994 to help found the Christian primary school.

In the first year we had 15 kids in the first 4 grades. Later we had 6 than 8 grades with more than 70 kids. During this time our three part

education institute was formed: kindergarten, primary and music school.

It is difficult to describe the wonderful experience we had when God answered our prayers, and financial help arrived, useful gifts we received or new, Christian teachers arrived who loved God, when more and more parents approached us with

their trust and desire that they wanted their children to attend our institutes. The list can go on and on. We could see the heavy burdens each of us had and we knew that only God could give us joy to carry them. Many visitors, people from outside expressed their surprised. We tried to explain the secret of our ministry: that we should do the God given tasks and the Lord himself will give strength and wisdom for such service.

When we do our work with drive often we forget to ask God's will about the future. It was especially true in my case for the developing work and the fruits of the ministry urged me to give even more energy into my growing responsibilities. When I felt serious signs of tiredness I asked God to teach and lead me about my future.

One thing is sure: at present I need rest otherwise I will completely burn out. My fellow workers accepted with sympathy the news that after the end of this school year I also close this phase of my life. Meanwhile they expressed with much love how sorry they are to be apart. In fact, I cannot tell how I will handle the feeling of being absent after these 16 years for we are bound with thousands of threads. I would not be able to make decision without knowing that it was right before God.

I am going to Northern Ireland for 6 months now, to do voluntary work at the Bloomfield Presbyterian Church. This church has been coming Bodrog for years supporting the ministry both spiritually and in practical ways. They offered me this possibility to be refreshed actively resting in similar surrounding. I believe that whatever I am going to learn there God will use it to renew me and to lead me on.

I am very thankful to God for the one and a half decades behind me in Bodrog. I am thankful first of all for the people: for my friends and brothers and sisters in the Lord Jesus; for the children I taught, for the parents, and for everyone I had relationship- a true love- relationship. The rest: the beautiful building, the good atmosphere in the school, the

results achieved; all serve this love and they come from the relationships. We have done everything from love: the welcoming of the children into the families; teaching them, doing the lots of extra work. And we have been given gifts and much help from love by friends near and far. This was done by God of love we passed on what we had received from him.

Yes, we planted and watered and God gave the growth. May God bless each of us wherever we are, may he lead us in his will day by day. I thank everyone for your prayers, for supporting our ministry from heart, including my personal life.

The story of a (used to be) homeless from Pécs

Gábor arrived to the Refugetown one gloomy autumn day. He was brought here by two elders of the Baptist Church in Pécs. He was standing in the office full of tears, with downcast eyes. He was hopeless and unshaven, and after an inquiring look at me, was just looking in front of him. I was told his story in a nutshell and was informed that he had now been living on the streets for three years. He had been beaten several times just for fun while he was sleeping on the street at nights. While he was sharing his story, memories made him cry and he run out from the office and came back, full of shame. When he came back I could see the effort he was making to concentrate. He looked at me seriously and told me that he did not want to stay or leave, he considered suicide as the only solution. While he was speaking I was praying to the Lord, asking him for right words to say that might help Gábor. Slowly a dialogue started between us. He stopped crying and I could see a glimpse of hope in his eyes. I could see he is going to trust me. I tried my best to encourage him to think that there must be a solution and there must be a reason why the Lord led him here. I told him that he is precious to God even with his past, and God definitely has a plan for his life. Gábor decided to stay. The first few days were difficult, he was straggling, and his mood was changing. He attended each church meeting and a positive change was beginning to be seen. We were told that he had used to read the Bible and know about God, but the alcohol was stronger than his relationship with God.

He run away from God and tried to find the solution to his problems in his addiction. And he went





although he had a family, an A level and knew some trade, he lost everyone and everything. We talked about the past and his wounds started to be healed. He settled down well, he enjoyed the quiet times and Bible readings. His enthusiasm remained; he was thirsty for God, reading Christian books all the way through. Whenever God spoke to him and touched him he shared it with me with joy. I watched how he manages with the withdrawal. I knew the tricks of those who want to drink, how they find alcohol. I could not see any sign of drinking on Gábor. When I asked him how he handled the lack of alcohol he answered that he had made up his mind to be free and even when there was a temptation he persevered. He kept attending the church services and sang joyfully. One night our spiritual leader, Péter Csaplár phoned me saying that Gábor was in the office and wanted to pray with us. I was very happy to go and that night a

miracle happened. I was able to witness a new birth. Gábor gave his life to the Lord, confessing his sins and his past weeping and asking God to free him from the bandage to alcohol as well. When we finished praying I received a joyful, happy brother in Christ. From that day I have watched Gábor's steps as his sister in Christ. I was able to see a treasure in the dust neglected by men but picked up and cleaned by God. Gábor was free indeed. His literacy was obvious. His kind empathetic character was developing and he kept growing as a Christian. His relationship with his wife and children was restored. During his first leave I was worrying and wondering how he would manage at home. I called him and he said he was able to stand firm through the temptations. When he came back we discussed what had happened at home. Gábor went home more and more often and felt that he wanted to serve among the homeless. The last time when he went home I thought that he might not have come back. Since then a few weeks have passed and Gábor has definitely left us for good. I am doing some of the administration for him, but without him now. He has found a home and is seeking ways of restoring his marriage. He attends the local church together with his wife and daughter. He will come back to collect his personal belongings, visiting us as our brother.
