## The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

### The life in the Mother's Shelter

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

Please pray for those who are afraid and running away due to the violence at home,

that they may find a home and may grow spiritually.

### **Projects and grants**

In 2005-2007, the Menedék Foundation provided two years of

educational training for its workers supported by HEFOP from the EU. Sadly, the organization, which handles that grant even today owes us 2,9 millions of HFTs.

In Kiskunmajsa from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2008 we have received the operation permit to accommodate homeless people, and so the work started, but



according to the budgetary law the permission and the normative support from the government does not go hand in hand. It meant that (9,6 millions HFTs) the functional expenses and the wages were not covered. So we tried to get help, grants from the Public Foundation for The Homeless (we did not get any) and from the Social and Labour Department we got help to cover nearly 2/3 of the missing normative support.

In 2009 the great financial challenge of the Foundation will be to provide the four millions of HFTs we had to add to the grant we won from HEFOP to modernize the Mother's Shelter.

We also won a grant with the aim to plan our ministries' strategy in the future. This project will start soon.

Sadly two applications for grants by the Men's Shelter were turned down. We are going to have another one for renovating the manual engineering of the home. Please pray for success.

On the second Saturday of May The Biblical Marriage counselling Ministry organized a conference for couples, Mónika Miklya Luzsányi and Ottilia and László Selmeczi were the teachers.

At the end of May the students of the music school had a concert, showing the fruits of their work. The school year was very blessed and successful. Seven children left the kindergarten to start their studies in primary school and ten pupils finished their studies in the primary school and go to secondary school.

The building project of the BOK (Bodrog Educational Centre) continued. Antal Fodor is in charge to lead that work. The kindergarten's wing (the kindergarten, the offices, the kitchen and 2 classrooms) were completed. The work on the last phase (the residential flats) started in June



with a help a team from Bloomfiel Presbyterian Church.

Philip Surgenor from Newtownards is going to stay for another year, and Andy Loughran, from Bloomfield arrived in July to start his one year voluntary service among us.

For our great joy God miraculously answered our prayers in our great need of school buses. Three businessmen donated a brand new 24 seated Mercedes bus as a gift to help our ministry. We were able to change our old 21 seated Iveco to a 46 seated Ikarus. These new buses are able to meet our need. We believe that even more children will receive Christian education and get to know God in the future in our institutes.

In mid July we had our music camp it was a great blessing and fun. At the end we had a concert where offering was taken to help an ill child and his family in the village.

At the end of the month we had a team of young people from Exodus, Northern Ireland, who together our young people had evangelistic programmes in the nearby villages.

In August, with a help of the Bloomfield Presbyterian Church we ran our English/Bible Holiday Club. During the week more than 50 kids came along. On three evenings we had evangelistic events in three villages nearby.

On 30<sup>th</sup> August we celebrated the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of "The Lord is good" Baptist Church and "The Beginning of Wisdom" Kindergarten. We praise the Lord for his faithfulness during the last 20 years.

### Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.



The numbers vary: sometimes there is a bigger number, sometimes there is a smaller, and the average number is 15-20. On Sunday morning services there are 35-40 people. There are two families who regularly attend our services from the town. We have kids' club for the children both in the mornings and in the afternoons. There are people who get saved and we can do follow up work with them. Our aim is to keep in touch with the families who have moved out from the Refugetown, so we visit them regularly.

We have a good relationship with the mission called 4H (Helping His Hungarian Heroes). On  $2^{nd}$  April, the leaders of that ministry, Eric and Rosemary Barrett came and taught us about the universe and how it reveals the almighty being of the Lord.

We have good, supporting relationship with the Budafok Baptist Church and the Baptist Church in Soltvadkért and other local churches.

## The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

### The life in the Mother's Shelter

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

It meant that (9,6 millions HFTs) the functional expenses and the wages were not covered. So we tried to get help, grants from the Public Foundation for The Homeless (we did not get any) and from the Social and Labour Department we got help to cover nearly 2/3 of the missing normative support.

In 2009 the great financial challenge of the Foundation will be to provide the four millions of HFTs we had to add to the grant we won from HEFOP to modernize the Mother's Shelter.

We also won a grant with the aim to plan our ministries' strategy in the future. This project will start soon.

Sadly two applications for grants by the Men's Shelter were turned down. We are going to have another one for renovating the manual engineering of the home. Please pray for success.

### Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.



The numbers vary: sometimes there is a bigger number, sometimes there is a smaller, and the average number is 15-20. On Sunday morning services there are 35-40 people. There are two families who regularly attend our services from the town. We have kids' club for the children both in the mornings and in the afternoons. There are people who get saved and we can do follow up work with them. Our aim is to keep in touch with the families who have moved out from the Refugetown, so we visit them regularly.

## The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

### The life in the Mother's Shelter

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

We also won a grant with the aim to plan our ministries' strategy in the future. This project will start soon.

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

It meant that (9,6 millions HFTs) the functional expenses and the wages were not covered. So we tried to get help, grants from the Public Foundation for The Homeless (we did not get any) and from the Social and Labour Department we got help to cover nearly 2/3 of the missing normative support.

In 2009 the great financial challenge of the Foundation will be to provide the four millions of HFTs we had to add to the grant we won from HEFOP to modernize the Mother's Shelter.

We also won a grant with the aim to plan our ministries' strategy in the future. This project will start soon.

Sadly two applications for grants by the Men's Shelter were turned down. We are going to have another one for renovating the manual engineering of the home. Please pray for success.

### Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.

## The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

## The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

#### Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.

The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.



The numbers vary: sometimes there is a bigger number, sometimes there is a smaller, and the average number is 15-20. On Sunday morning services there are 35-40 people. There are two families who regularly attend our services from the town. We have kids' club for the children both in the mornings and in the afternoons. There are people who get saved and we can do follow up work with them. Our aim is to keep in touch with the families who have moved out from the Refugetown, so we visit them regularly.

We have a good relationship with the mission called 4H (Helping His Hungarian Heroes). On  $2^{nd}$  April, the leaders of that ministry, Eric and Rosemary Barrett came and taught us about the universe and how it reveals the almighty being of the Lord.

We have good, supporting relationship with the Budafok Baptist Church and the Baptist Church in Soltvadkért and other local churches.

## The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

We also won a grant with the aim to plan our ministries' strategy in the future. This project will start soon.

Sadly two applications for grants by the Men's Shelter were turned down. We are going to have another one for renovating the manual engineering of the home. Please pray for success.

#### Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.



The numbers vary: sometimes there is a bigger number, sometimes there is a smaller, and the average number is 15-20. On Sunday morning services there are 35-40 people. There are two families who regularly attend our services from the town. We have kids' club for the children both in the mornings and in the afternoons. ## The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

#### Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.



The numbers vary: sometimes there is a bigger number, sometimes there is a smaller, and the average number is 15-20. On Sunday morning services there are 35-40 people. There are two families who regularly attend our services from the town. We have kids' club for the children both in the mornings and in the afternoons. ## The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

## The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

#### Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.



The numbers vary: sometimes there is a bigger number, sometimes there is a smaller, and the average number is 15-20. On Sunday morning services there are 35-40 people. There are two families who regularly attend our services from the town. We have kids' club for the children both in the mornings and in the afternoons. There are people who get saved and we can do follow up work with them. Our aim is to keep in touch with the families who have moved out from the Refugetown, so we visit them regularly.

We have a good relationship with the mission called 4H (Helping His Hungarian Heroes). On  $2^{nd}$  April, the leaders of that ministry, Eric and Rosemary Barrett came and taught us about the universe and how it reveals the almighty being of the Lord.

# The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

#### The life in the Mother's Shelter

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

#### Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.



The numbers vary: sometimes there is a bigger number, sometimes there is a smaller, and the average number is 15-20. On Sunday morning services there are 35-40 people. There are two families who regularly attend our services from the town. We have kids' club for the children both in the mornings and in the afternoons. There are people who get saved and we can do follow up work with them. Our aim is to keep in touch with the families who have moved out from the Refugetown, so we visit them regularly.

# The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

#### The life in the Mother's Shelter

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.

# The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

# The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

#### The life in the Mother's Shelter

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

Please pray for those who are afraid and running away due to the violence at home,

that they may find a home and may grow spiritually.

# Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.

according to the budgetary law the permission and the normative support from the government does not go hand in hand. # The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

## The life in the Mother's Shelter

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

Please pray for those who are afraid and running away due to the violence at home,

that they may find a home and may grow spiritually.

In Kiskunmajsa from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2008 we have received the operation permit to accommodate homeless people, and so the work started, but



according to the budgetary law the permission and the normative support from the government does not go hand in hand. It meant that (9,6 millions HFTs) the functional expenses and the wages were not covered. So we tried to get help, grants from the Public Foundation for The Homeless (we did not get any) and from the Social and Labour Department we got help to cover nearly 2/3 of the missing normative support.

In 2009 the great financial challenge of the Foundation will be to provide the four millions of HFTs we had to add to the grant we won from HEFOP to modernize the Mother's Shelter.

We also won a grant with the aim to plan our ministries' strategy in the future. This project will start soon.

Sadly two applications for grants by the Men's Shelter were turned down. We are going to have another one for renovating the manual engineering of the home. Please pray for success.

# Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. # The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

## The life in the Mother's Shelter

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

Please pray for those who are afraid and running away due to the violence at home,

that they may find a home and may grow spiritually.

In Kiskunmajsa from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2008 we have received the operation permit to accommodate homeless people, and so the work started, but



according to the budgetary law the permission and the normative support from the government does not go hand in hand. It meant that (9,6 millions HFTs) the functional expenses and the wages were not covered. So we tried to get help, grants from the Public Foundation for The Homeless (we did not get any) and from the Social and Labour Department we got help to cover nearly 2/3 of the missing normative support.

In 2009 the great financial challenge of the Foundation will be to provide the four millions of HFTs we had to add to the grant we won from HEFOP to modernize the Mother's Shelter.

We also won a grant with the aim to plan our ministries' strategy in the future. This project will start soon.

Sadly two applications for grants by the Men's Shelter were turned down. We are going to have another one for renovating the manual engineering of the home. Please pray for success.

# Spiritual life in the Refugetown

# Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.



The numbers vary: sometimes there is a bigger number, sometimes there is a smaller, and the average number is 15-20. On Sunday morning services there are 35-40 people. There are two families who regularly attend our services from the town. We have kids' club for the children both in the mornings and in the afternoons. There are people who get saved and we can do follow up work with them. Our aim is to keep in touch with the families who have moved out from the Refugetown, so we visit them regularly.

We have a good relationship with the mission called 4H (Helping His Hungarian Heroes). On  $2^{nd}$  April, the leaders of that ministry, Eric and Rosemary Barrett came and taught us about the universe and how it reveals the almighty being of the Lord.

# The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

## The life in the Mother's Shelter

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

Please pray for those who are afraid and running away due to the violence at home,

that they may find a home and may grow spiritually.

In Kiskunmajsa from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2008 we have received the operation permit to accommodate homeless people, and so the work started, but



according to the budgetary law the permission and the normative support from the government does not go hand in hand. It meant that (9,6 millions HFTs) the functional expenses and the wages were not covered. So we tried to get help, grants from the Public Foundation for The Homeless (we did not get any) and from the Social and Labour Department we got help to cover nearly 2/3 of the missing normative support.

In 2009 the great financial challenge of the Foundation will be to provide the four millions of HFTs we had to add to the grant we won from HEFOP to modernize the Mother's Shelter.

We also won a grant with the aim to plan our ministries' strategy in the future. This project will start soon.

Sadly two applications for grants by the Men's Shelter were turned down. We are going to have another one for renovating the manual engineering of the home. Please pray for success.

# Spiritual life in the Refugetown

Every day there are lots of opportunities to do counselling and to talk about spiritual issues and challenges with the people who are under our care. We are seeking the Lord's guidance as we counsel the people.

On Mondays there is a Bible study for the workers, which helps to build up the spiritual unity as a serving body. The goal is "*love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.*" (*1Tim. 1:5*) Each evening there is a Bible study with two fold aims. One is to make disciples. There is practical and relevant teaching about everyday life to help us to grow as followers of Christ. The second part of the Bible study is about worship and prayer and praise. We have church services on Thursdays and on Sundays. At present we are studying 2 Samuel.

# The fruit bearing tree

Two weeks ago I pruned the fig tree in the garden of the Men's Shelter. I started treating it two or three years ago. Since then the illness has gone: before that it was very ill: its branches were full of fungus, louses attacked it and it grew in its own way.

Now even the fruits from last year were hanging, they were black and withered. The knives of the pruning scissors were working hard in my hands: the dried died branches were falling on the ground. From time to time I stopped to have a look; I did not want to cause any harm. I am not a gardener, I do not know a lot about pruning. But I was interested in how to free that tree from the fruitless branches. I wanted the tree to produce fruit, which is good to look at and edible. It would not be a problem if it only produces few but lovely, healthy fruits.

People are much more sensitive than any tree. Those who work with people who are despised know very well how much fight, failure, victory pain and dilemma it takes to care for them as we teach, help, give example, correct them and show them the way to heaven.

In Luke 13. 6-8 Jesus tells a story. He talks about a fig tree that has an owner. For three years there was no fruit so the owner decided to cut it down so it would not use up the soil. The man who took care of the vineyard knew the circumstances but did not give up hope: he begged the owner, trying to convince him with his professional knowledge to give one more year to the tree.

Each of us belong to God, even those who are at the edge of our society, God is their owner even when many do not recognize them. By grace we are called to cut, to prune the dried branches, hoping for fruit in the future. We can be such gardeners.

The Mother's Shelter

#### The Mother's Shelter is being born again.

**Early July the renovation work of the Mother's Shelter started.** The budget of this project is approximately 40 millions of HFTs. More than 36 millions are covered by the support we won from a grant specialized for renovating/modernizing homes in central Hungary.

The building itself is more than 100 years old, there are ten bedrooms, a play room, a kitchen, a dining room, a laundry room, two offices and a gate house. The two computers in the shelter are old. The whole building is worn out: the lagging system is out of date, the walls take in water, there is no access for disabled people, etc.

**Please pray for the renovation project as it is being carried out.** The project manager of the grant is Zoltán Kovács, the chairman of the Refuge Foundation, who receives help from a professional staff.

## The life in the Mother's Shelter

The leader of the work is Géza Huszár, who is in that post as a retired person. About the life in the Shelter he says:

It is a special that the Shelter is in the former prayer house in the Szent Gellért Street.

The schedule of the work is ongoing, 24 hours a day. We have permission for 30 people and at present there are nine mothers with their children. Most of the children attend kindergarten or primary school

Each "family" (the mother and her children) are accommodated in their own room, there is play room, a baby kitchen and a kitchen and a dining room. Outside there is a small playground too. The residents can live here for eighteen months at the longest. We would like to use this time in the best way, to show them and demonstrate to them the Christian life. Everyone in the staff is a born again believer, they either belong to Baptist or Pentecostal churches in Budapest and it is a joy to serve together with them. A great number of the residents attend the Budafok Baptist Church regularly and the children can join in the kids' programmes in the church. It is good to see the changes in their lives by the grace of Christ and to be a tool of God in their lives.

Visitors are welcomed from churches. There are small teams coming who organize activities for the children and who talk to the mothers. College and university students who study social work usually join in as they do their practical placement here, and get useful experience in the Home. On Monday mornings there is a prayer time for the staff, led by Géza Kovács, on Tuesdays in the Menedék (Refuge) Office we have a workshop and a quite time, led by Zoltán Kovács. The governing body of the Refuge Foundation meets on the first Tuesday each month.

according to the budgetary law the permission and the normative support from the government does not go hand in hand. It meant that (9,6 millions HFTs) the functional expenses and the wages were not covered. So we tried to get help, grants from the Public Foundation for The Homeless (we did not get any) and from the Social and Labour Department we got help to cover nearly 2/3 of the missing normative support.

In 2009 the great financial challenge of the Foundation will be to provide the four millions of HFTs we had to add to the grant we won from HEFOP to modernize the Mother's Shelter.

We also won a grant with the aim to plan our ministries' strategy in the future. This project will start soon.

Sadly two applications for grants by the Men's Shelter were turned down. We are going to have another one for renovating the manual engineering of the home. Please pray for success.
