### Real freedom

In the cold times of the Chistmas season walking on the streets we tend to recognize more the misery. We stumble across and wonder about the fact that there are people who do not have a home to return to.

Radical "civil rights" movements are defending the right of homeless people to camp in parks, to sleep on benches, to stay in phone booths, to sleep in the metro. And they do this for the good of the homeless, referring to their rights. Important question: is this really their interest to have the chance to freeze outside in the minuses? To live without basic living conditions? Is it enough that we can bring them a cup of warm tea when it is

minus twenty out there..?

This is not real freedom. Real freedom is when there is a place to get a good rest: we give them the freedom of having a perspective, the freedom of hope. To calm down after the hounted times, to take a deep breath and look forward. Of course the more time one spends on the streets the harder it gets.

Fortunately to this direction significant progress has been made in the recent years in Budapest: over six-hundred beds were added to the supply system and - with the participation of Menedék Foundation - the Budapest Homeless Consortium was founded. The aim of both of these is to accompany the homeless people and to care for them personally.

In the last years twenty-four young people arrived to the Men's Shelter through the Consortium. Many of them now rent apartments or live with relatives after resolved family conflicts.

Those we meet on the streets are the tip of the iceberg. If we would ask the people of Budapest how they see the homeless, they would probably tell us about alcoholics who smell bad, cause trouble on the bus and yell at the ones who refuse to give them money. Indeed, there are those who deal with complex mental and health issues, alcohol or drug problems, who need to be convinced that they need help and require complex care. For without help comes death. And we do not want to give up on them.

But the majority is unnoticed. We do not recognize them by the mentioned caracteristics, or we "do not have the time" to notice them. They have not (yet) took the typical homeless habits, but they do not have a home anymore. Because the bank took it, or they got divorced, came a sudden disease or as a result of a reckless move they are losing

> ground. There was no support, no helping mechanisms, no strong community. There are many who just need a chance, a moment to take a deep breath: temporary help to get back on their feet and rebuild their lives. Often painfully, but they move forward. People who got shelter at our place come back and tell us how they "found their place at work", "are sober and pay the rent", "resolved

conflicts and went home". Or return because they "slipped again and need help".

Real freedom is not found on the streets. The streets are trouble. The real freedom is at Home. Home is not defined by the fact that I own it or that I pay the rent. Home is where I am free to be free, where I am in peace and I am surrounded by my mates. In the atmosphere of Home there is always change in people. This is why we feel the best at Home, and those who never had one, feel at Home in our homes or shelters. Can anybody be at Home in Kiskunmajsa at the Refuge Town, in Bodrog with foster parents, or in Budapest at the Men's Shelter or at the Mother's Shelter? Our experience is yes. It might be temporary, but they are at Home. Freely.

# One more year for Menedék! - Supporting Program

Dear Supporters!

27 years ago when we started the service of Menedék Fundation out of offerings of voluntary commitment, faith, time, money and energies. In the last decades our service areas have been established in three geographic parts of the country: in Budapest, Kiskunmajsa and Bodrog. Every day we provide shelter in our homes for 165 people and more than 160 children recieve education in our schools and kindergartens.

Over the past decades we dealt with a wide range of people from the margins of society; many of them went through lifechanging experiences and put their trust in God. We are grateful to the Lord for renewed lives, restored relationships, healing from addictions, and for opportunities for indigent people to build a new life. Through the service of Menedék new churches were established where the staff and clients can practice community.

Since the end of the communist era and the change of regime we work in accordance with the social and child protection laws, largely with the help of normative state support, which, however, has not increased (in fact, decreased and not only in real terms), and this led the operation of our service into a critical situation.

We are at a turning point. 15% of our basic operating expenditure is missing, approximately 14 million HUF a year. This missing amount could be obtained by the collaboration of our community members, individuals, businesses and churches if with their support they help us take care of homeless people.

Our experience is that our work is very much needed. There is constant overapplication to our homes, we are unable to help everyone. Massive amount of families and individuals lost and loose their homes due to bank loans. Thus, the work of Menedék should be expending and not restricted. But so far our goal is the survival.

We thank all our former, and future supporters for joining the service of Menedék! The help coming from you is necessary and essential. Please keep praying for us and for the people that stay in our homes.

### **Brief News**

Áron Fülöp and his wife, Mogi from the Kőszikla (Solid Rock) Baptist Church of Budaörs joined our staff as janitors in August, and started to work in September. We are grateful to God for their presence, especially because this way or stuggle to provide constant staff presence at night is over.

We are organizing activities to the children living in this home on a weekly basis. We started as one big group, but then we felt the need to study the Bible separately with the older kids. Another split of groups would be necessary due to the age differences, since we want to provide an opportunity to the little ones to play, but at the same time to the older ones to pay attention to the stories. At this point this is impossible because the lack of space.



In the beginning of this year we received a bigger donation through the Johannita Segítő Szolgálat (Johannita Support Service) to expand the dining section of

our kitchen. This gift was special to us, because so far our families only had places to eat on the corridor, and we did not have the resources to cover this alteration. We are thankful for being able to say that now all the families have a place to sit down for a meal together, or even a place to celebrate special days, birthdays, holidays.

In addition to the expansion we could buy new furniture for the kitchen and modern facilities. We would like to express our gratitude again to the Johannita Support Service.

During the summer we were pleased to discover that one of our family-care staff members, Gulyás-Kis Andrea is expecting a baby. We are still looking for an equally committed and faithful staff member with the right qualifications to replace her. For more information, please visit our website.

In July 2013 we received foreign volunteers from the Bethánia CE Szövetség (Bethany CE Union) to organize colorful and fun events to the children. We sang and played a lot, saw a theatre performance, painted etc. Thank you for your visit and for serving!

Last summer our children had the opportunity to go to Biatorbágy or to Tóalmás to various kid's camps. A smaller group could join the Erzsébet camp in Doboz.

There was something in these lines that got to me. First I did not know what, but now I know.

That purity, selflessness and exemplary love towards others that were within these lines. I prayed to the Lord Jesus to give me strength and honest words, and went down to the office. I thanked Ági for the envelope and sat down in front of her. We talked a lot, openly and frankly. She told me God is the answer for all of my problems if I fully receive Him into my heart. She told me not to be discouraged about bad things in the past, because God accepts and loves me with all my mistakes. But I need to believe that God sacrificed this son for everyone, but he would have done the same if I would have been the only one on earth. She asked me if I was ready to take this step.

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." (2Cor 5:17)

In July we said goodbye to our colleague Attila Gulyás who left us to work elsewhere. He was replaced by Pál Bartolák as a full-time social worker.

At the end of summer we carried out minor repairs around the house: stairs-, pavement- and ramp-constructions. We were happy for the opportunity to change the kitchen pavement as well.

In September we cooked by the campfire again: chatted about the summer by a bowl of Goulash soup. It was good to be together again!



Every day we have quiet times, group discussions before dinner, where, in addition to the power of community, we get a chance to grow by the Word of God. On Sundays many attend church services.

At the end of October some of our habitants visited the youth weekend of the József street Baptist Church, and there is a man who since than regularly attends church programs.

Also in October in the frameworks of a new agreement with the Hungarian Maltese Charity Service we signed a grant contract with a subsidy of 1.8 million HUF on accommodating ten more homeless people, which significantly reduces our operating loss (3,000,000 HUF per year).

# How did I get to the Men's Shelter?

I am Ferenc Sárközi (38). I have never thought I would live in a homeless shelter. My story began on the day of the 1st of May, 2013, when - totally incomprehensibly to me - I got kicked out of the dorm where I lived. I was studying sociology at the University of ELTE. Since I had no money to rent an apartment, I tried to ask for help from multiple places but I was rejected constantly.

It seemed like I was going to live on the streets when I was advised to ask for help from an institution in the 21th district. We called the head of this institution to see if there was room for me. I got an appointment, told him my story, he told me I could move in the next day. I was on the streets hesitating for two days; I did not know what to expect from a homeless shelter. My fear turned out to be right, there were a lot of conflicts, thefts, I was falsely accused of stealing money and got arrested. One day two people got into a fight over two slices of bread with butter. I was not sure if it was my place. We had to leave the house during the day, from 7am to 4pm. There were days when I did nothing but sitting on a bench reading (when I had something to read). "This is not life" - I thought. I said I would never go to a homeless shelter again, enough is enough. One have to become an animal to live in a place like those. I decided to move out.

In those times I had someone who helped me and let me stay at his place for two weeks. Meanwhile I was thinking: "What now...?"., when an old shop assistant lady suggested that, if I had no other option, I could go to the Men's Shelter of Menedék, she knew them personally. I visited the Men's Shelter.

My interview was on the 29th of August, 2013 with two of the staff members. In the conversation they were interested in where I came from. I told them that I was raised by the state and I am not keeping in touch with my family. I started in a special school and made it to the university. Now with the support of the Labour Centre I am attending a retraining course to become an IT system administrator. I am hoping to get a job more easily with this qualification. It is no secret that I want to reapply to go to the Eötvös Loránd University to study sociology.



After the interview, on 9th of September I moved into the Man's Shelter. Here I received a lot of help, both in the spiritual and and the material sense. It was very important for me to find a part-time job because of school. Social workers are investing a lot of energy into making the residents re-enter the normal social life. I mean to help people find a job and to be able to rent an apartment.

The institution has Christian roots, therefore they encourage you to seek God, but it is "not required to believe." A resident staff member, Pál Bartolák found Christ in this institution years ago, I quote one of his writings:

"My life finally became complete, had a meaning, a content; I experianced this transformation, and I believe, I know, that you out on the streets, you out in the dirt, in the grime, who have to endure people's contemptuous gaze, you also need the salvation of Jesus Christ. I am asking you, whatever you do, wherever you are, in any state, find the first Christian community where you can get more information on how your life can be settled by the one true and living God."

I hope I will manage to put my life back together, I will do everything in my power to do so, any I ask for God's help as well, because I think that many things depend on it as well.

# The Refuge Town renewing and growing

After the 1997 purchase and the 1999 acquisition of the new business license we arrived to a new milestone in the history of the Refuge Town in Kiskunmajsa. The buildings accommodating two institutions are being rebuilt from 2013.

The building originally built in the mid-70s deteriorated not only aesthetically over the past few years, but its operation and maintenance also became a significant burden on the Menedék Foundation. Conditions cause problems to the residents and gives a lot of additional work for the Foundation's staff, which is beyond their job description and personal capacity.

In 2011 from spring to fall we worked to be able to submit an appropriate proposal to the tender No. TIOP-3.4.2-11/1 of the New Széchenyi Plan, called "Creation of modern structure for the Refuge Town in Kiskunmajsa."

The application was supported by the National Development Agency, so soon we could start the reconstruction. The European Regional Development Fund and the budget of the Republic of Hungary co-financed the project that resulted in a better use of the interior of this the massive building. Different operational areas are being separated, along with the creation of new features.

The building got new doors, insulation, the entire mechanical (heating and domestic hot water) system was replaced, and new, economical boilers were installed. The successful tender allows the improvement of accessibility and institutional communication.

Of course, as any renovation, this also causes some discomfort, but after a few months a renovated and sustainably warm building will be waiting for the residents.

### "Whoever serves…

...as one who serves by the strength that God supplies..." (1Peter 4:11)

We had the opportunity to do a very special service from April this year.

We have taken care of a 38-year-old mother, Erzsike, who was diagnosed with lung cancer last October. She and her four children lived in our temporary home. When she learned that her disease is incurable, she put her and her children's lives in God's hands. In a state of painful agony she asked that her children would be taken away from her, because she could not take care of them and more. By the power of God, all authorities were very helpful and understanding, children were placed in a home with foster parents in Kiskunmajsa. Menedék felt the responsibility to help and take care of the mother. Katalin Csöndes as a voluntary helper played a prominent role in caring for Erzsike, being with her all day all night. Erzsike eventually passed away on the 6th of September. Her ashes were put to rest in the Menedék Churchyard on the 19th of September.

The final months of Erzsike taught us that we must never lose our faith in God, and that the pain can be tolerated with dignity. We are grateful that we could be there for her during her struggle with the illness. The professional collaboration for the children and for Erzsike was exemplary, and the case will be presented within the frameworks of a TÁMOP project on the national level.

### **Fruits**

In October, two of our habitants passed the exam after a professional forestry training. There are three working in the public works program, six people have reported permanent jobs, and four of them are involved in ongoing occasional works. Several people are helping on a regular basis in the daily life of the Temporary Home, and also keeping our environment clean and tidy.

We are very proud of our "wanting to move forward" residents. Significant changes are taking place in the life of one of them; I would like to briefly tell her story:

Mária is of Roma origins, she was born in 1964. She started to go to school at the age of 13 because their parents have died early and she had to take care of her younger siblings. In 1993, she got married and then had six children, four boys and two girls. Her husband did not cherish their marriage, he abused her and he was always surrounded with other women. Eight years ago, after an untreated post partem depression and due to her husband's infidelity, she got into a traumatic state and eventually into depression. She had also become unable to take care of her children. She was also treated in a mental institution for 6 months.

Five years ago they got divorced, but the husband got custody of the children. Mária lived in the Temporary Homes for the Homeless multiple times. Her goal has always been to get custody of her three little ones, as the older kids have been already leading independent lives.

Previously she could only solve her income and housing situation to short term periods. She is staying again in our institution since May, 2012.

Today we can say that as a result of the mental health care she is pretty much cured of severe depression and now have to take medication only at night. She has a job for a year now. She transmits a large part of her income each month to her children, and maintains a very good relationship with them, but she is constantly worried about them. Regularly participates in the group discussions and worship services, and has been able to laugh. When she has time, always helps with the daily tasks of the institution.

### Love in Nikla

God started a very special kind of work in Nikla. This work reached a great peak this summer. Namely, that we held a 5-days Bible club for elementary school students with the help of our brothers from Newtownards, Northern Ireland.

We were excited to do this, but at the same time it was a great challenge. I personally just came back from the United States and I was superexcited to serve this week as an interpreter. I did not really know what to expect, but I was looking forward to this week. The topics of the week were the following: Jesus the way, the truth and the life; Jesus the bread of life; Jesus the resurrection and the life; Jesus the light of the world. In addition we studied the mission story of David Livingstone. In the breaks between the stories we were playing, we had competitions every day and also we learned Bible verses by heart. Lot of things amazed me this week. I was working as an interpreter for the first time in my life, and for the first time at this place where there is such a great need of Jesus.

I feed especially honored that God sent me to do this service; it is a great experience to be the "channel" between God, the preacher and the listeners. It was also fascinating how we started with 30 kids and this number was growing every single day and reached 50 by Friday by the kids inviting their friends, siblings and even parents. Another miracle was that we planned to teach the kids 2 Bible verses that week, but we ended up teaching them at least on every day because they were so interested and quick to learn. At the end of the week 18 kids could remember at least four.

What was especially touching for me is how the kids that we had to pick up in the morning in another village were so happy every day. It was a joy to listen to them how they filled the bus with worship songs! It is such a pleasure to see how God takes care of the smallest, poorest, and loves them so much. God has started something in Nikla. And I do not think he is about to stop!
